

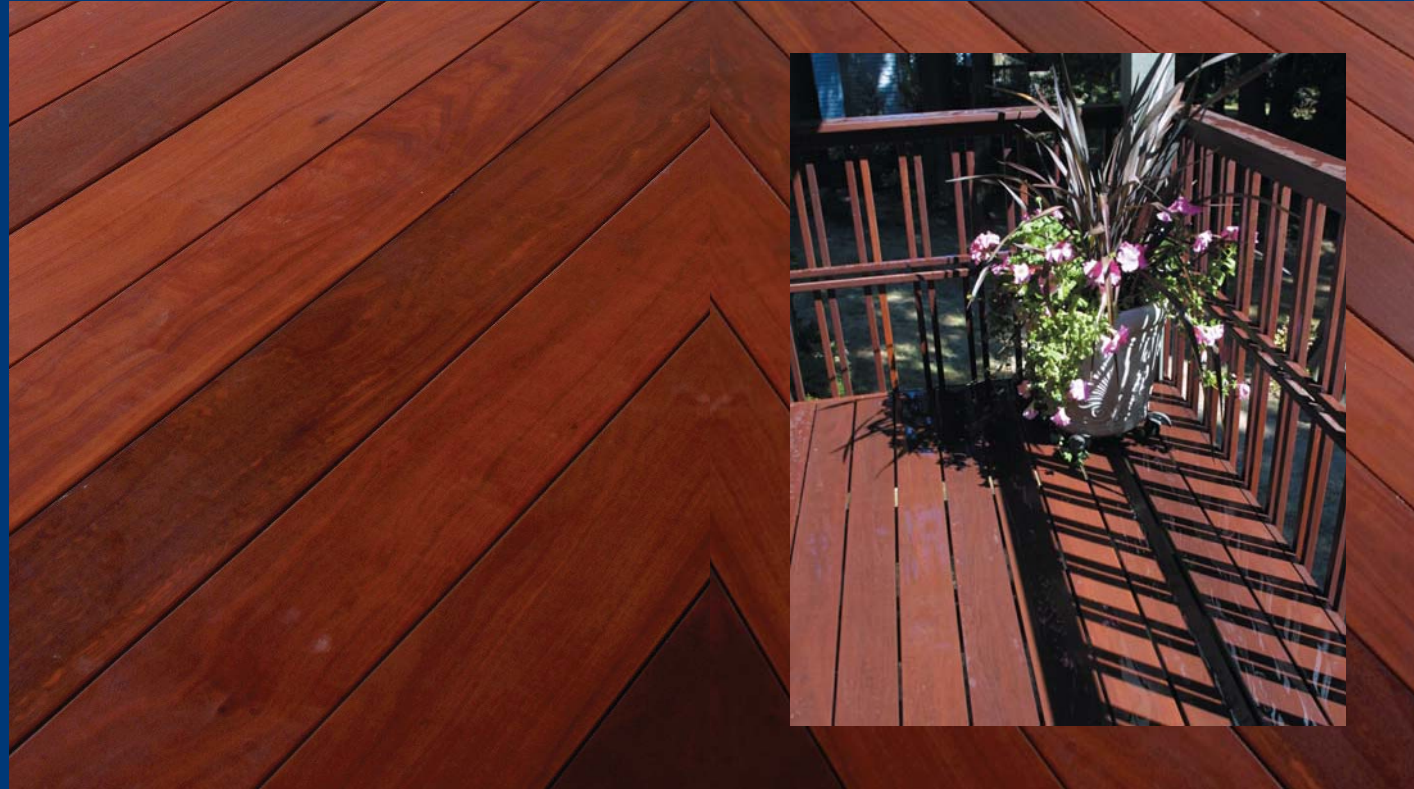

Brazilian Redwood is an environmentally responsible alternative to chemically treated and composite decking products. Nearly blemish free, Brazilian Redwood is strong enough to use 1" boards in place of 5/4" or 2" boards.

Brazilian Redwood is a dark red wood which will fade to a silver grey if left untreated. To retain the rich color, we recommend an oil based finish with ultraviolet inhibitors. Regular cleaning and reapplication of finish will ensure that the wood retains its beauty for many years.

Available in decking sizes 1x4 through 2x12, 2x2 balusters, and 4x4 posts, we offer a complete package for deck, arbors, benches and many other outdoor projects.
